<p><b>§ 5(1)(b)</b></p>	<p>Rules of the implementation of the student's obligation to participate in particular types of classes</p>	<p>Students are required to attend all classes included in the study plan.</p> <p>Participation in practical activities, within the subjects of individual and team forms of physical activity, which require an above-average level of physical fitness of the student in the first and second level of the degree course: Physical and Health Education, is conditional on providing the Faculty of Educational Sciences (WNoW) Dean's Office with a current medical certificate. The above medical certificate should be applied for at the facilities included in the referral issued by the Dean of WNoW. If an up-to-date medical certificate is not provided, the student will not be allowed to participate in the aforementioned activities carried out in accordance with the study programme for the respective semester of study.</p>
<p><b>§ 5(1)(c)</b></p>	<p>Scope and conditions of conducting educational classes, knowledge or skills tests and diploma examinations in a foreign language and preparing diploma theses in a foreign language</p>	<p>None</p>

<b>§ 5(1)(d)</b>	The credit period for degree programmes conducted as a uniform master's degree programme or as a part-time programme as either a semester or a year of study,	The credit period is the semester.
<b>§ 5(1)(e)</b>	Admissibility and conditions for repeating the first semester or year of study	No repetition of the first semester of study is allowed. It is permitted to repeat the second semester of study due to documented health reasons or documented random events.
<b>§ 5(1)(f)</b>	Maximum number of teaching hours and maximum number of examinations per academic year	According to the study plan; the maximum number of teaching hours per academic year is 900, the maximum number of examinations is 8.
<b>§ 5(1)(g)</b>	Minimum average score in the course of study to date allowing to apply for an individual study plan and curriculum (IPS)	A score average of no less than 4.75.
<b>§ 5(1)(h)</b>	Conditions of admissibility and procedure for resolving a student's appeal against a decision to refuse credit for a course/component classes	<p>It is permissible for a student to appeal against a decision to refuse credit in the event of non-compliance with the conditions set out under § 40 of the Regulations.</p> <p>1.The student has the right to appeal to the Dean within 7 days. In particularly justified cases, the Dean, in consultation with the head of the relevant</p>

		<p>organisational unit, decides to appoint a commission to test the student's knowledge. The Commission consists of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) the head of the organisational unit as a chairperson of the commission,</li> <li>b) the person teaching the subject in question,</li> <li>c) the second specialist in the subject covered by the credit.</li> </ul> <p>The commission also includes a representative of the student self-government as an observer. A commission examination of the student's knowledge may take place despite the absence of the student self-government representative.</p> <p>2. A commission examination of the student's knowledge should take within 10 days of the Dean's decision.</p> <p>3. The commission decides on the outcome of the pass by a majority of votes and, in the event of a tie, the chairman has the casting vote.</p>

<b>§ 5(1)(j)</b>	Scope of requirements of the diploma examination	<p>Majors: pedagogy, sport pedagogy, pre-school and early childhood pedagogy, physical education and health education - the master's/bachelor's examination comprises: fundamentals of pedagogical knowledge, specialisation knowledge and knowledge of the thesis problem area.</p>

		The psychology major - the master's examination includes: core psychological knowledge, specialised knowledge and knowledge of the thesis problem area. The number of questions in the diploma examination shall not be less than 3.
<b>§ 5(1)(k)</b>	Procedure for conducting open diploma examinations	No open diploma examinations are foreseen.
<b>§ 5(2)(a)</b>	Maximum number of cases of repeating a semester/year in the majors taught at the faculty	During the course of study, a student may repeat each semester once, starting from the second semester of study. It is permitted to resume studies once, starting from the second year of study. It is permissible to resume studies in the period up to 5 academic years from the date of deletion.
<b>§ 5(2)(b)</b>	Minimum number of ECTS credits or minimum number of majors allowing a student to pass a semester/year conditionally and to be enrolled in the next semester/year of study,	The minimum requirements for conditional credit for a semester and for a student to be registered for the next semester of study include: - obtaining a number of scores lower (maximum) by 5 than the number of ECTS credits foreseen in the study plan for a given semester or failing maximum one major.

<b>§ 5(2)(d)</b>	Mandatory subjects without passing of which a student may not be enrolled in the next semester/year of study, regardless of the score obtained	none

<b>§ 5(2)(e)</b>	Rules other than those provided for in § 23 of these Regulations for the transfer of students from full-time to part-time study or vice versa, rules applicable to the whole faculty or to individual majors	<p>Rules for transferring students from part-time to full-time study:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- average score of 4.9 and participation in national or international research projects,</li> <li>or</li> <li>- scholarships from the Minister competent for Higher Education and participation in national or international research projects.</li> </ul> <p>Transfer of students from full-time to part-time studies is possible without any additional requirements.</p>
<b>§ 5(2)(e1)</b>	Rules other than those provided for in § 25 of these Regulations for the transfer of students from other universities, applicable to the whole faculty or to individual majors	Transfer is possible if the student meets the conditions for enrolment in terms of the number of credits obtained.
<b>§ 5(2)(f)</b>	ECTS credit conversion rates for individual majors and specialities where the exchange of students with foreign or national institutions does not guarantee the equivalence of student achievements	none

<b>§ 5(2)(g)</b>	Possibility to apply from the first semester in the second degree study programme for an individual study plan and curriculum (IPS),	An individual study plan and curriculum (IPS) may be applied for by a graduate of a first degree programme who has obtained a very good grade on their diploma and the average score of at least 4.5 for the first degree programme.
<b>§ 5(2)(h)</b>	Rules other than provided for in § 38(7) and (8) for the completion of a course of study	A maximum of two majors from consecutive years of study may be credited towards further study.
<b>§ 5(2)(i)</b>	Rules for obtaining credit and taking examinations other than those provided for in § 38(9) of these regulations	none
<b>§ 5(2)(j)</b>	Additional designations or examples of written work fulfilling the requirements of the thesis, in addition to those indicated in § 52	none
